Dear Child Care Professionals of Georgia:

I am writing to give you a preview of a change that will make DECAL's Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS) program more convenient for child care providers. As you may know, CAPS administers the federal Child Care and Development Funds (CCDF) for the state. We issue scholarships to eligible low-income families for use with Quality Rated child care providers and reimburse the providers serving these children.

Until now our relationships with CAPS providers have been handled by a

vendor. Beginning in the fourth quarter of this year, a dedicated team of DECAL employees will support CAPS providers directly. We at DECAL have longstanding relationships with Georgia child care providers, and we are making this change so that we can build on our existing relationships and improve services for providers. We organized our new provider relations team in consultation with some of our current CAPS providers.

The CAPS provider relations team will perform all the functions the vendor currently does,

including enrollment of new providers, annual renewals, customer support, and provider training. We will also expand our outreach and training activities. We'll take a proactive approach to helping providers bill correctly; we'll offer more training and technical assistance; and we'll reach out to newly licensed providers to let them know about the advantages of participating in CAPS.

CAPS supports eligible families in reaching self-sufficiency, and CAPS providers play a crucial role in making high-quality care and education available to low-income families. CAPS providers can bill weekly for their services and receive payment by ACH transfer, usually within 10 days. CAPS providers also receive tiered reimbursement based on Quality Rated star levels. I know that providing child care is a labor of love, and I am grateful for all you do to support Georgia's children.

Juneteenth Activities and Resources

Art

Begin by reading "The Colors of Us" by Karen Katz. Then in small groups help children create and name their skin tone by mixing paint. While the children work, talk about different skin colors positively and about the importance of differences, encouraging the children to notice similarities and differences. Discuss why uniqueness is important. After all the children have made their skin color have them paint together on a large poster board or butcher paper, creating a community painting of all the skin colors represented in the classroom. Children can add to this piece by writing their names and/or the name of their skin color. Post the artwork for everyone to see.

Materials: large surface for painting; poster board, butcher paper, etc., cups, bowls, or other containers for mixing, plastic spoons, large popsicle sticks, or other item for mixing, brown, white, and black paint, small amounts of orange, yellow, and red paint to tint skin colors, paint brushes.

Math

Begin by reading "Opal Lee and What It Means to Be Free: The True Story of the Grandmother of Juneteenth" by Alice Faye Duncan. Then, in small groups, make Juneteenth "Red Punch" Strawberry Lemonade. While making the lemonade, highlight math concepts while having children follow the steps (sequencing), taste the individual ingredients (attributes), recognize and name quantity as children measure, recognize and name sensory impressions as ingredients mix together and change color/texture/taste (attributes). Once the product is finished, make a chart with comparisons to other drinks they have tried before that are the same or different and list other red drinks they have seen or tasted before. Post the charts/graphs for everyone to see.

Materials: Juneteenth "red punch" strawberry lemonade recipe from book, food materials, child-friendly knives and cutting spaces (boards, paper plates, etc.), measuring cups, blender/mixer, pitcher/punch bowl, cups for serving, chart paper, markers or other writing materials.

Juneteenth Activities and Resources

Fine Motor

Begin by reading "Juneteenth for Mazie" by Floyd Cooper. Afterwards, provide children with materials to string necklaces, bracelets, or other adornments.

Materials: string, wire, yarn, pipe cleaners, blue, red, white beads, dyed pasta (ditalini, rigatoni, penne), buttons, etc.
