

Brooks and Joan Fortune Foundation

The Brooks and Joan Fortune Foundation primarily provides funds to support education, art, and outreach programs and projects. In general, the foundation desires to support specific activities that result in a defined outcome rather than general operating funds or fundraising campaigns. Nonprofit, 501(c) 3 tax-exempt status is required.

Deadlines: Ongoing

Bulk Milk - Chef Ann Foundation

This healthy school lunch initiative is a partnership founded by the Chef Ann Foundation and the Posner Foundation. Bulk Milk is a granting program that provides schools and districts with bulk milk dispensing equipment and support, including a bulk milk dispenser, stand, reusable cups, dish racks, program and marketing materials, and technical assistance. Open to: K-12 school districts that participate in the National School Lunch Program with an enrollment of at least 100 students per school site. Schools must have a dish machine to wash reusable cups and be able to identify a bulk milk bib supplier in their area.

Deadlines: June 27th, 2024

Computers For Learning

The Computers for Learning program places computers in our classrooms and prepares our children to contribute and compete in the 21st century. The program transfers excess Federal computer equipment to schools and educational nonprofit organizations, giving special consideration to those with the greatest need. A school is eligible to receive donations through the Computers for Learning program if it is public, private, or parochial, serving pre-kindergarten through grade 12 students. Day care centers must provide a state-approved preschool curriculum. Nonprofit, 501(c) 3 tax-exempt status is required.

Deadlines: Ongoing

The Dollar General Literacy Foundation

The Dollar General Literacy Foundation provides grant funding to support literacy and education initiatives serving individuals of all ages. The Foundation funds nonprofit organizations, schools, and libraries within a 15-mile radius of Dollar General stores in the states in which they operate.

Deadlines: Varies

Early Literacy Assistance Program - Literacy Empowerment Foundation

When resources permit, the Literacy Empowerment Foundation offers very cost-effective reading resources through our Early Literacy Assistance Program. These collections contain 102 softcover books. Each set contains 6 copies of 17 different titles. These 102 book sets are available for \$149.00 on a first-come, first-served basis.

Deadlines: Ongoing

The Lisa Libraries

The Lisa Libraries provides books to organizations who serve in a low-income or underserved area that needs a small library, needs to rebuild, or add to a library, or serves children who would benefit by being given new books to take home. A donation of books from The Lisa Libraries is free, they request that recipient organizations cover the shipping and handling costs, which is based on the destination and quantity of books. Nonprofit, 501(c) 3 tax-exempt status is required.

Deadlines: Ongoing

National Education Foundation Qualified Zone Academy Bond Grant

Public school districts with 35% or more students on Free/Reduced lunch are eligible to apply to the National Education Foundation for the 10% matching grant that enables the eligible school districts to apply for \$1 million to \$30 million Federal QZAB zero-interest funds for facilities renovation, energy efficiency, renewable energy, technology, and curriculum.

Deadline: Ongoing

Pets in the Classroom

The Pets in the Classroom grant program supports teachers in enhancing students' educational and personal development through interaction with pets in their classroom. The program offers Rebate grants, Store Coupon grants (from Petco, PetSmart, etc.), and Sustaining grants to help pay for your pet's upkeep. Pets in the Classroom is open to Pre-K through 9th grade classrooms in public or private schools.

Deadlines: Ongoing

The Reading Resource Project - Literacy Empowerment Foundation

The Reading Resource Project is an ongoing program that runs throughout the year. The program distributes high quality, softcover books for Read Across America Day, National Drop Everything and Read Day, Children's Book Week, International Children's Book Day, and other Literacy Programs. Reading Resource Project books are 100 book sets. Any literacy-based effort qualifies for these books. You do not have to be a school or teacher. Reading Resource Project books are available in a limited quantity on a first come, first served basis. Each 100-book set will contain a variety of at least 10 different titles. Recipients merely pay shipping, handling, and administrative costs, which is only \$0.88 cents per softcover book (\$88.00 per set of 100 books).

Deadlines: Ongoing

Salad Bars to Schools - Chef Ann Foundation

Salad Bars to Schools (SB2S) is a granting program that is a partnership of the Chef Ann Foundation and Whole Kids Foundation. It provides schools and districts with salad bar equipment and support, including Cambro salad bars, camchillers, and technical assistance. Open to: K-12 school districts that participate in the National School Lunch Program with an enrollment of at least 100 students per school site.

Deadlines: Ongoing

Toshiba America Foundation

Toshiba America Foundation (TAF) grants fund the projects ideas and materials teachers need to innovate in their Science, technology, engineering, and math classrooms. TAF is interested in funding innovative projects designed by teachers or small teams of teachers for use in their own schools and classrooms. K-5 grade teachers are invited to apply on-line for a Toshiba America Foundation grant of not more than \$1,000 to help bring an innovative project into their own classroom.

Deadlines: October 1st of each year
