development?	

Were the teacher and child interaction positive?
Did there appear to be enough materials and equipment for
each child in the classroom?
Did the overall feeling in the center seem positive and upbeat?
Were teachers using developmentally appropriate and
individually appropriate teaching strategies?
Were parents welcome to observe and participate at any time?
Do the teachers observe, assess and record children's
developmental progress?
Are staff required to regularly attend staff meetings and
professional development opportunities?
How long have the teachers been at the center – on average?
years months. Is the teacher retention rate
satisfactory?
Do all staff have CPR and First Aid training?
Do teachers meet with parents regularly to discuss the child's
needs, interests and abilities?
Is there a security system for the center to keep strangers from
entering children areas? If not, ask what is the policy and
procedures for keeping strangers out of the children areas.
Is the kitchen clean? Go inside and meet the cook, open the
refrigerator.
Did the teachers use gloves for diaper changing and food
services?
Did you notice teachers and children washing their hands?
Did you notice teachers and emiliaren washing their manus.
